Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Wilson left Tuesday morning for Omaha. Mrs. Wilson will also visit in Seward for a few days.

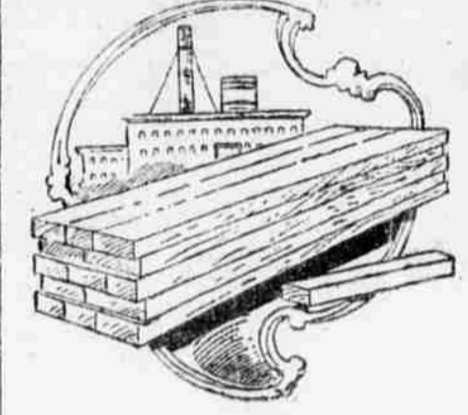
Miss Dorothy Maulick returned last Thursday from a three months visit in Omaha the guest of her sister, Mrs. Syfert.
