We find that the petition contains 773 names, we find that the abstract of votes for the year 1908, furnished by the county clerk there were polled 1306 votes, and further find that the said petition contains a majority of 120 signers and legal voters.

We further find that the proposed new county of Higgins will contain more than 450 square miles, leaving the county of Custer with more than 450 square miles.

We therefore recommend, that the petition be granted and that the question of the erection of the proposed new county of Higgins, be submitted to a vote of the people of Custer county, Nebraska, at the next general election, and that notice be given, and that a vote be canvassed as required by law in such cases, and that the form of ballot shall be "For the new County of Higgins" and "Against the new County of Higgins."

It was moved and carried that the report of the committee be accepted and adopted as read, and that the county clerk be and is hereby instructed to carry out the recommendations of the committee.

The committee appointed to investigate and report upon the petition of the erection of the proposed new county of Sheldon made the following report:

Which petition was in words and figures as follows:
To the Board of Supervisors Custer County, Nebraska.

Honorable Sirs: We, the undersigned, legal voters of Custer county, Nebraska, residing in the territory hereinafter described and sought to be detached from Custer county, do respectfully petition your honorable body for the erection of a new county out of the territory now comprising Custer county, Nebraska, and that the question be submitted to a vote of the people at the next general election and that you call and order such election. The new county shall be known as Sheldon county and be bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at the northeast corner of section 25, township 18, range 17, on the east county line of said county, thence running west about 18 miles to the northwest corner of section 30, township 17, range 19, thence south two miles to the southwest corner of section 31, same town and range; thence east on the township line about one-half mile to the northwest corner of section 6, township 16, range 19; thence south about six miles to the northwest corner of section 6 township 15, range 19, thence west about 6 miles to the northwest corner section 6, town 15, range 20, thence south about 18 miles to the county line and the southwest corner of section 31, township 13, range 20, thence east along the south line of said county about 24 miles to the southeast corner of Custer county, thence north and west along the east line of said county about 26 miles to the northeast corner of section 25, township 17, range

17, and the place of beginning.

We certify that we live on the land described opposite our names and we ask that our names be counted in favor of said petition, and that in no event shall they be counted against it.

Frank Jennings, being first duly sworn on his oath, says, that he has resided in the County of Custer and state of Nebraska, for about 24 years, that he is well acquainted with the voters residing in the territory sought to be detached from Custer county and known as Sheldon county, that he has carefully read the petitions circulated by Frank Jennings, J. Barks and Charles Mattley and the names attached to said petitions are the genuine signatures of the persons they represent, and the said petitions contain a majority of all the legal voters residing in said territory described as Sheldon county as affiant verily believes.

Affiant further says that he has taken the certificate from the county clerk as to the number of voters residing in said Territory at the last election and added thereto all the new comers since then, that said petition is sufficient to a number to entitle them to relief prayed for.

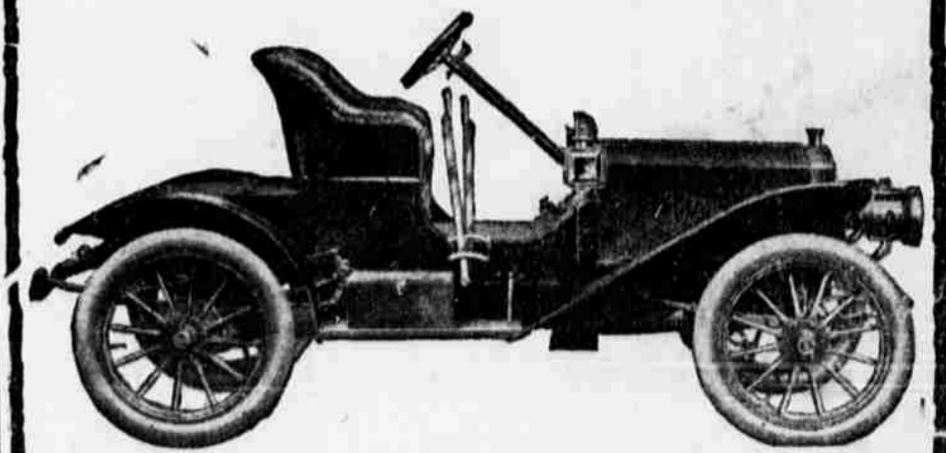
