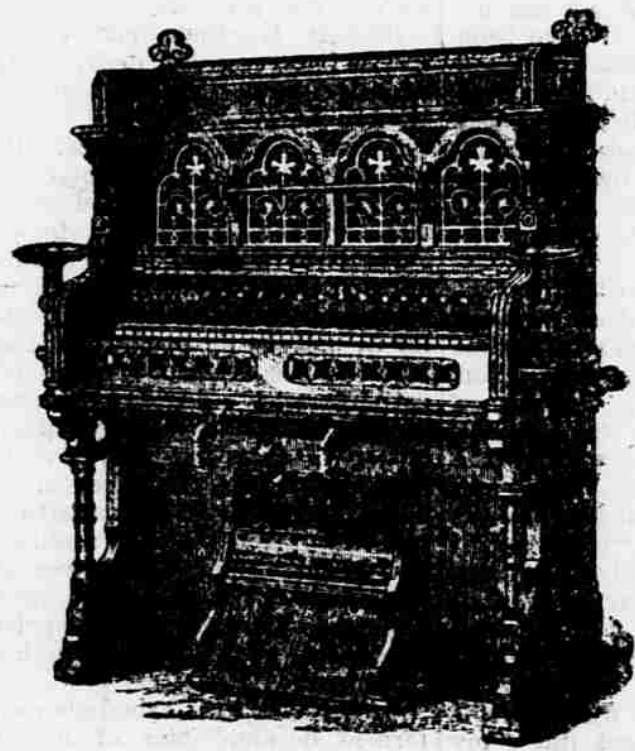

GENERAL NEWS.

CAPT. MAYNE REED, the celebrated English novelist, died on Sunday evening, aged sixty-five.

THE federal grand jury at Leavenworth has found a true bill against Oklahoma Payne, for conspiracy to violate the laws of the United States.

VICTORIA has erected a monument to her late gillie, John Brown, at Balmoral and has ordered two others, one at Windsor and another at Froze-nore.
