Gentlemen: -From and after the receipt of this circular, all testimony for claimants in establishing pre-emption or homestead rights, or mineral entries, and in contested cases, must be reduced to writing under the direct supervision of Registers and Receivers whenever such testimony is taken in towns where local offices are situated; but Registers and Receivers are not entitled to any fees for examining and approving testimony in pre-emption cases where the proof is taken before a judge or clerk of a
