DUTY OF THE BOARD OF CONTROL. It shall be the duty of the board of control to prepare and publish a course of study, and to exercise a general direction over the work of the reading Education, and Education; the Century, cirele.

COUNTY CIRCLES.

County circles shall be organized, and their management vested in county boards of control, consisting of president, secretary, treasurer, and two other members, to be chosen at a meeting of the members of the county circle, which shall be held at the time and place of holding the county institute; except the first board may be chosen by a convention of teachers of the county, to be called by the county superintendent.
