Under the law of 1792 the President of the Senate, or, if there were none, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, would act as President until the disability were removed or a President elected. By the Hoar bill this introduction of legislative officers into the Presidential succession is avoided and with it the possibility of a political change not authorized by public opinion. The succes-sion is to the Secretary of State, then the Secretary of War and other cabinet officers in order, who have been duly appointed with the advice and consent of the Senate and are eligible to the Presidency by the Constitution. The officer so succeeding shall act as President for the remainder of the term, if that be not more than twelve months; otherwise he shall notify the States of an election to fill the vacancy, as provided in the present law. This provision has the merit of simplicity and directness in carrying out the purpose of the Constitution that "the Congress may, by law, provide for the case of removal, death, resignation or inability both of the President or Vice-President, declaring what officer shall then act as President."


