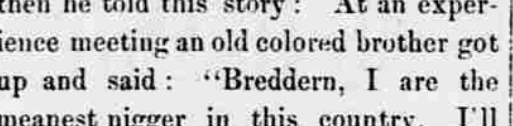
HENRY T. CHURCH. Postoffice, Osborn, Neb. Range: Red Willow creek, above Carriac.



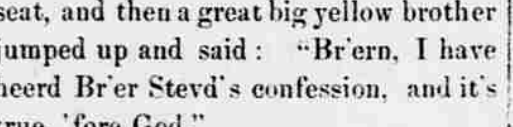
GEORGE J. FREDERICK. Postoffice address, McCook, Nebraska. Range: Four miles southwest of McCook.



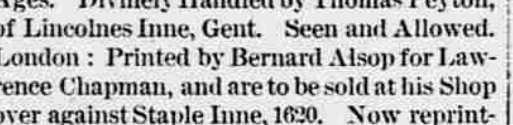
