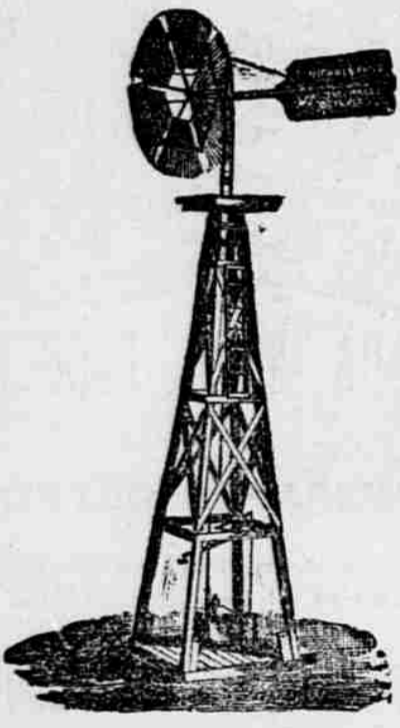

A National Corn Show

Will be held Nov. 8th to 19th, in the Exposition Building, Chicago, in connection with National Fat-stock Show. One Hundred Premiums will be awarded on exhibits of 20 lbs. of corn in the ear. Of these, fifty-six are Cash Premiums of \$10 and \$5. Competition will be between the growers themselves, in each of the seven principal corn growing States. Four Premiums of \$15 and \$25 are to be awarded as sweepstakes in the competition between the growers of the different states. Most of the Express Companies cooperate, by offering to carry parcels for exhibition, all distances, over their respective lines at a small, nominal charge of 25 cents, if not exceeding 55 lbs. placing distant and near localities on a par. 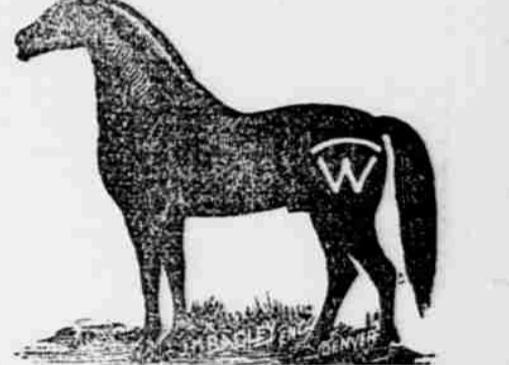

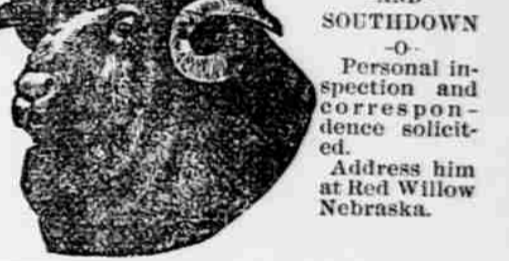
