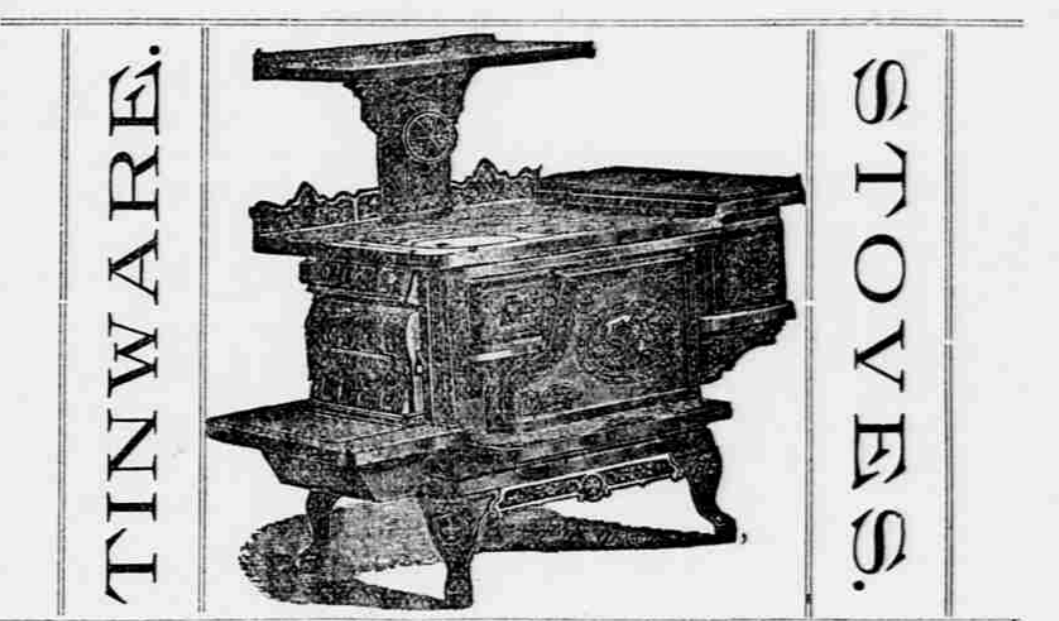

THE Commander-in-chief of the French army, and Secretary of War-General Boulanger, will demand for the army budget, this year, it is reported, \$80,000,000. France will, if this money is voted, raise the army pool in Europe this year. It has cost in recent years \$2,000,000 a day to keep on foot the armies of Europe. If the other nations keep the proportion thus established by France the rate will be about \$3,000,000 a day. In one year of peace Europe spends the price of a war.
