

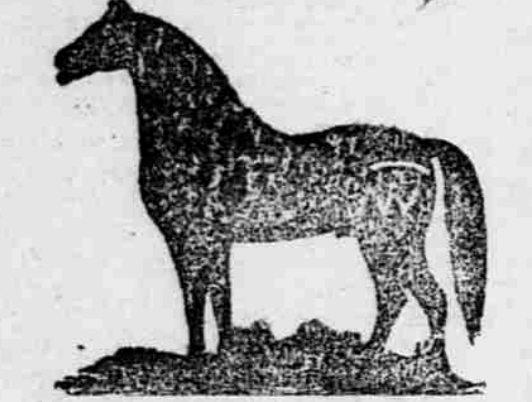

John Francis, was appointed overseer District No. 4.

OFFICIAL BONDS APPROVED. James H Everist assessor Danbury Precinct. Adolph Schmidt overseer District No. 2.

Joseph Spotts constable Willow Grove precinct. On motion commissioners Crabtree and Bolles were designated as the commissioners to appraise S 1/2 SE 1/4 section 36, township 3, range 30, as per application to purchase same by W S Fitch Lessee.

On motion the county treasurer was ordered to transfer forty-nine dollars from the district bond fund of school district No. 1 to the district levy fund of said school district.

On motion the board adjourned to meet April 13th.

On motion the petition of C. D. Cramer and others, was granted, and the west 3/4 section of public road No. 85, from the north end of 4th Avenue in Indianola, to the northeast corner of Lot 1, in section 7, township 3, range 27.

On motion the petition of J. C. Mitchell and others, was granted, establishing road No. 83, along the east side of lots 1 and 2, of said section, the west side of said road being the east line of said lots.
