GENERAL LEW WALLACE is quoted as saying in a recent conversation: "I can tell you what I would do if I were President. Immediately after my inauguration I would call my cabinet together and say: 'Gentlemen, I desire to urgently request that each of you report to me in thirty days from date that you have discharged every Democrat in your respective departments and filed his place with a Republican.'"

A Catholic colonization society with a capital stock of \$1,000,000, divided into 4,000 shares, has just been organized in Pittsburg, the object of which is to establish Catholic colonies in the south, and to engage in manufacturing, mining, lumbering and stock raising. Large tracts of suitable land will be occupied by the colony in Northern Georgia and Alabama, and it is the intention to increase the number of those who have been active in its organization, the capital stock will be increased to one million dollars.

A MAN who does not take a newspaper came into a drug store one day last week. He stepped on an awning; tried to blow out the electric light at the hotel; tried and tried to light his cigar with it; paid twenty-five cents for an almanac; was mad because he could not get a drink at the post office; put a nickel in the slot at the post office and raised a terrible row because the man didn't appear; wanted to kick the conductor of a train because he wouldn't sell him a postage stamp; and watched the town clock four hours waiting for it to strike.

CONTRARY to expectation in many quarters Senator Freeston in Paris received a great victory for Gen. Boulanger, he receiving over 50,000 majority. The fight was a hotly contested one, money being used without limit, and the result shows the great popularity in wicked Paris of Boulanger, or the cause he is supposed to represent. He is the fancy of the hour with the Parisians and the next hour will probably find them exceedingly sorry. Boulanger's bluff and gaudy show have attracted and fascinated the ignorant classes and hence his popularity. He has also promised a change in the existing order of things, should he acquire the necessary power, and change of any kind is most agreeable to Frenchmen. It is the opinion of many that he has given a wonderful prestige to a dangerous character in French politics.

### Of Interest to Publishers.

Section 125 of chapter 77 provides that the printer's fee for publishing redemption notices shall be \$1.00. In the notices to be printed three times and the notice will average about two squares of space. This is an outrage, as there is no paper in Nebraska, but charges us regular advertisers three times that amount for such space. This parsimonious provision is not in the interest of the people, but of the money sharks, who speculate on the poor man's necessities. Senator Freeston has introduced a bill amending this section so that the printer's fee for publishing these notices shall be the regular legal rates.

Senator Freeston, morning introduced in the interest of the publishers, and the people generally. It is a fiction of the law that ignorance of the law excuses no man, yet the state, as a rule, issues very little papers to inform its citizens of the statutory enactments. The senator's bill provides for the publication of the entire-body of the session laws enacted at this session in every newspaper of this state that shall elect to accept the conditions, paying therefor a fee of \$1.00 and \$2.00 on every 100 circulation.

Senator Freeston introduced on Monday a bill defining the number of publications required in a weekly newspaper.

Section 1 defines ten days to mean five publications within that period.

Section 2 provides that the clerk of the district court, county clerk, sheriff, registrar, and register of deeds shall designate the newspapers in which the notices pertaining to their several offices shall be published, and the county board the papers in which all other county notices shall be published. In counties exceeding 10,000 inhabitants and not more than 2,000, two papers and in counties exceeding 20,000 inhabitants three papers shall be designated.

Section 4 provides that these designations shall be made in January of each year, and provide that where two or three papers are selected, the cost shall not exceed one rate.

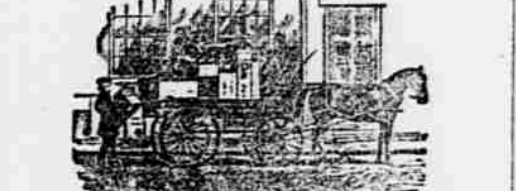

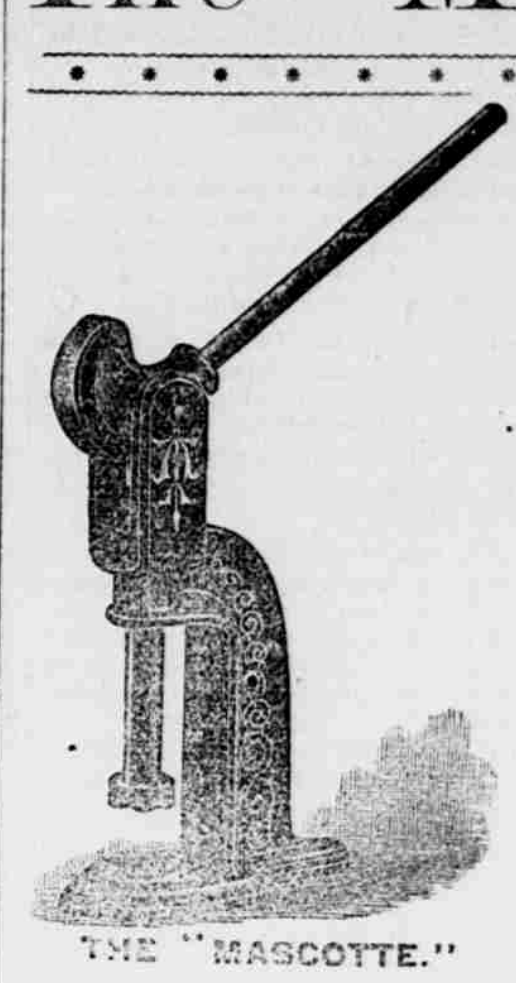
