Board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Full board present.

On motion of Mr. Bennett the board proceeded to consider the request or petition of Justin A. Wilcox, asking the board to reconsider the minutes of this board of June 17, 1890.

Motion by Mr. Bennett: "I move the board that the prayer of the petition or request of Justin A. Wilcox for the alteration and correction of the aforesaid minutes of the board as adopted and approved on June 17, 1890, in the matter of the petition of R. B. Archibald et al be denied and rejected, for the reason that said minutes of the proceedings and acts of the board in the matter of the petition of said Archibald et al as amended and approved on June 17, 1890, are found by the board to be the correct acts, minutes and proceedings of said board of county commissioners in the matter of the said petition of Archibald et al for the re-location of the county-seat of Red Willow county."

Motion carried. Voting "yes," Crabtree and Bennett; voting "no," Bolles.

ROAD NO. 246.

Petition of John Whittaker, C. H. Jacobs et al asking for a public road read and considered. The board finds that all requirements of law have been fully complied with and that no claims for damage have been filed, on motion same was granted establishing a public road as follows: Commencing at N. Uncle John Rowland's wife, Amanda, arrived home from Stout, Colo., last week, which lends the smile to the old man's face.

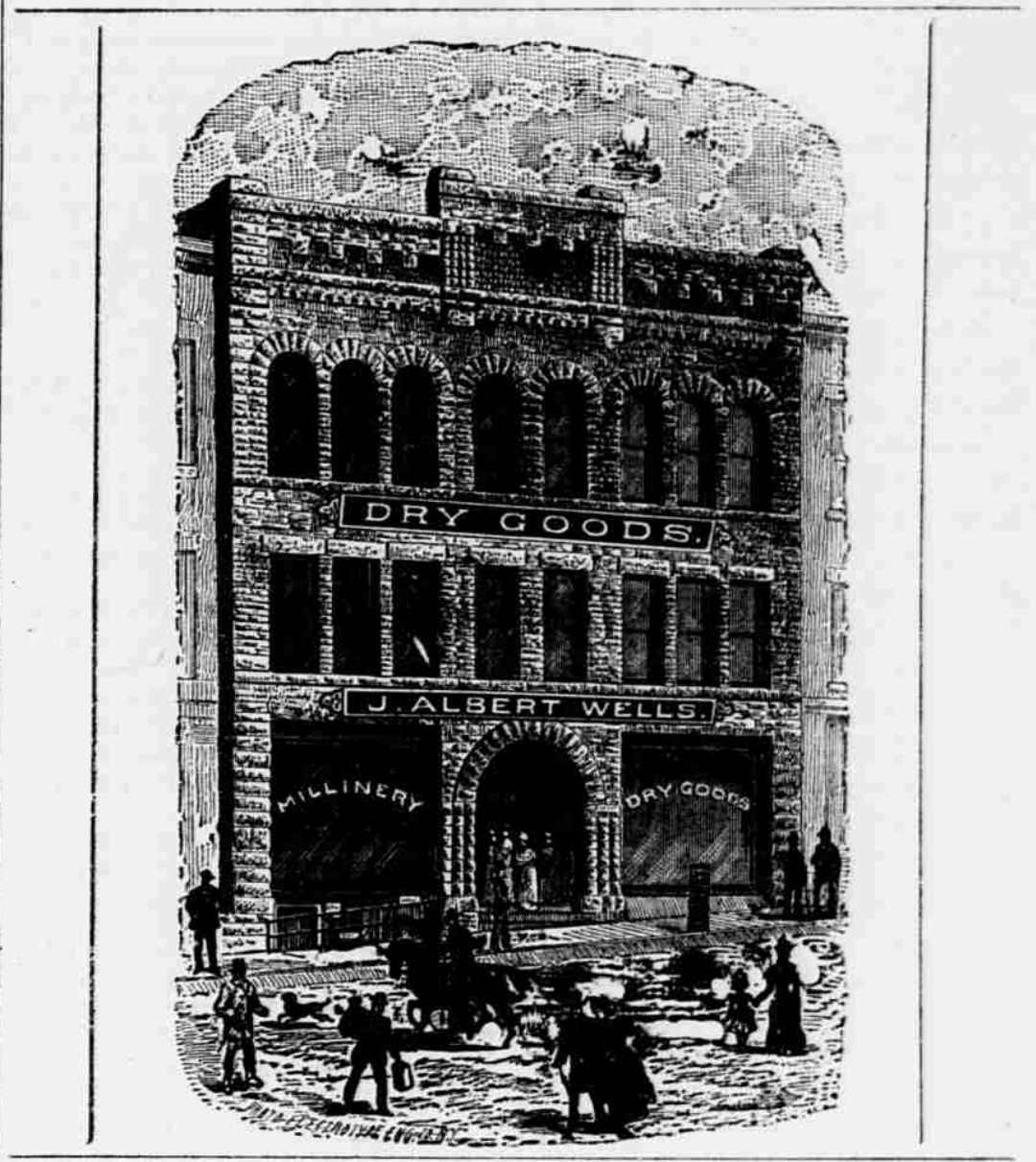
