An ordinance providing for the supply of water to the city of McCook, in the County of Red Wil-low, and State of Nebraska, and its inhabit-ants, and authorizing the Lincoln Land Com-pany to maintain its system of water works as now constructed, and establishing a tariff of reasonable water rates, and requiring said company to erect and maintain a stand pipe, and put in nine additional fire hydrants and one watering trough, and to extend their water me watering trough, and to extend their water nains along Dennison street in and through West McCook, and prescribing rules and regulations for the consumption of said water de lations for the consumption of said water derived from said water works, and providing a penalty for the violation of the same, and authorizing the Mayor and Council of said city to enter into a contract with said Lincoln Land Company, its successors or assigns, for the improvement, maintainence and operation of said water water works, in said city, and to repeal Ordinance No. 31, and all ordinances repeal Ordinance No. 31, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, it ordinance by the Mayor and Council of the City of McCook:

SECTION 1. That in consideration of the benefits which will result to the City of McCook and its inhabitants from the erection, maintainence and operation of water works in said city, there is operation of water works in said city, there is sereby granted to the Lincoln Land Company, its successors and assigns, the right to maintain, improve and operate the system of water works it now has ip said city, and to add to the same, and to construct other works and buildings necessary to 2 successful operation of said works; and also the right to maintain and to lay mains, pipes, conduits and erect hydrants in and along the streets, lanes, avenues and alleys and public grounds of the said City of McCook, for supplying water for fire, domestic and other purposes, for the term of twenty years, and the common council of said twenty years, and the common council of said city is hereby empowered on behalf of the city, to enter into contracts with said Lincoin Land Company for the construction, maintainence and operation of a system of water worksin accordance with the provisions and requirements of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. The Lincoln Land Company shall at all times after the erection of the stand pipe hereinafter mentioned, turnish all water necessary nereinatter mentioned, furnish all water necessary for fire protection, domestic and lawn and street sprinkling purposes from wells and not river water at the rates and under the conditions here-inafter mentioned and in consideration of the benefits that will result to the said City of Me-Cook by the election and maintenance of said water works the said city agrees to rent and does water works the said city agrees to rent and does rent for the term of twenty years, thirty double discharge, anti-freezing fire hydrants, two watering troughs and one street sprinkler. Twentyone of said hydrants and one watering trough are now located on the mains of said water works of said city, and nine hydrants and one watering rough to be located at such points as the city council may direct on the mains as now laid and to be laid in said city. For such hydrants and watering irough the said City of McCook agrees, after the erection of said stand pipe to pay the annual remtal of fifty dollars, payable quarterly, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July and the first day of October of each year of said term, w.th legal rate of interes each year of said term, with legal rate of interest on deferred payments. The hydrants when erect-ed shall be used exclusively for the extinction of fire and necessary practice of fire companies; but in all cases of fire practice there shall be no nozzle used larger than one inch nor more than two hy-drants used at one time nor discharged from an orfice larger than one and one half high, and in all cases of practice the superintendint of said company shall be notified SECTION 3. The said Lincoln Land Company, its successors or assigns, shall by December first,

SECTION 3. The said characteristic and company, its successors or assigns, shall by December first, 1893, extend the mains of said water works from McDowell street in said city west on Dennison street to the corporate limits and from Dennison street south on Maryland avenue to the right away of the railway company and north of Dennison street on said avenue 150 feet, and from Dennison street south Michigan ave to the right away nison street south Michigan ave to the right away of the railway company and north of Dennisor street on said avenue 150 feet, and such ex tension will have sufficient pressure to throw water one hundred feet from the end of the nozzle when one hundred feet from the end of the nozzle when six hundred feet of hose is used with one inch ring nozzle, with one line of hose; in consideration of said extension and the building of said stand pipe, the city agrees to the rental of the nine additional hydrants and one watering trough provided for in section two of this ordinance. The said company shall extend the mains of said water works to any part of the city when required by resolutions of the city council and when such last extens on shall be regarded there shall be exceeded. resolutions of the city council and when such last extens.on shall be required there shall be erected for the use of said city one fire hydrant or watering trough for each four hundred feet of mains to be located at points in said city designated by the city council, and for each of such hydrants the city shall pay to the said company the sum of fifty dollars annually, payable quarterly as aforesaid.

The city council of said city reserving the right to revise and amend the water rates hereinafter established after the expiration of eight years from the passage of this ordinance and once every six years thereafter during the existence of the contract herein provided for between the Lincoln Land Company and the City of McCook do establish as the tariff of water rates per annum to consumers from the Lincoln Land Land Company's water works at McCook, the following:

SECTION 18. It shall be unlawful for any one to tap the mains of said Company, with any other than lead pipe; provided, however, that such lead pipe and the curb line of the street, and all other pipe used may be of galvanized iron or lead at the option of the party putting in the same.

SECTION 10. Water running to waste or to keep ipes from freezing is prohibited under penalty of aving water shut off with or without notice. SECTION 11. Sprinkling permits shall be grant-ed for the lawn sprinkling season only on the pay-ment of rate aforesaid to the said company except as herein otherwise provided. Said lawn sprink-ling season shall begin with the fifteenth day of ling season shall begin with the fifteenth day of April ahd shall end with the fifteenth day of October in each year, provided the permit is taken out after the first of any quarter, in such case payment shall be made dating from the first of the quarter in which the permit was taken out. Under lawn sprinkling permits the use of water is limited to such seasons for sprinkling only and the use of hand hose with no larger than three-sixteenth nozhand hose with no larger than three-sixteenth noz-zle, is limited to the hours of from six a, m. to eight o'clock a. m. and from seven o'clock p. m. to eight o'clock a. m. and from seven o'clock p. m. to nine o'clock p. m. central time, each day during the lawn sprinkling season. The use of hand hose without nozzle as a substitute for a fountain or al-lowing it to run while not held by hand is forbid-den. Any use of a sprinkling attachment or de-vice using water in excess of the amount that would pass through a three-sixteenths inch nozzle is a violation of the terms of the permit. SECTION 12. Lawn and fountain permits shall be considered a luxury and may be limited to less

be considered a luxury and may be limited to less hours in case of shortage or from any other cause it may seem to be impossible to supply water to all persons but a proportionate deduction from the price of service shall be made from the time water is not furnished; in all cases domestic use shall take precedence over lawns and fountains.

SECTION 13. Water rates except lawn and fountain tax, shall be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of January, April, July and October; lawn and fountain tax to be paid according to contract, and unless taxes are paid within fifteen days after the same become due ten per cent, shall be added thereto for the expense of collecting the same.

SECTION 14. The superintendent of the said water works or any other proper officer of the company shall have access, at all reasonable hours, to all parts of the premises to which water is supplied to make necessary examinations and all refusals on the part of the consumer of such access shall be deemed sufficient cause to turn off

SECTION 15. The Lincoln Land Company is nereby required to erect and maintain at an eleva-tion as great as their water tank in the park in the City of McCook, a stand pipe for said water works, which stand pipe shall not be less than twenty feet in diameter and et least eighty-five feet high, and shall be of three-fourths inch steel, and shall be erected and ready for use

steel, and shall be erected and ready for use by December first, 1893.

SECTION 16. It shall be unlawful for any plumber or plumbers or pipe fitters, to do any work upon any of the pipes of the system of water works owned by the Lincoln Land Company nutil such plumber or plumbers or pipe fitters have first procured a license to do so from the City Council of McCook, and give a bond in the sum of one thousand dollars, and shall immediately report to the superintendent of water works. Any one holding a license as aforesaid, under any ordinance now existing, or hereafter works. Any one holding a license as aforesaid, under any ordinance now existing, or hereafter to be passed, shall have a right to tap the mains of the Licoln Land Company's water works. SECTION 17. The franchise given to said Lincoln Land Company by section one of this ordinance, is granted upon the condition that the company comply substantially with requirements of this ordinance, in reference to the building of the stand pipe and the laying of water mains in West McCook, as required by section 3 of this ordinance, and the failure of said Company to make said improvements within the time limited by this ordinance, shall work a forfeiture of said franchise.

SECTION 21. The Lincoln Land Company is hereby authorized to make such usual and ordinary rules and regulations, not inconsistent

ordinary rules and regulations, not inconsistent with this ordinance, as may be necessary to the proper and convenient use and operation of its water works in the City of McCook.

SECTION 22. Violations of sections seven: eight; ten; eleven; thirteen; fourteen and iwenty of this ordinance, by the consumer, shall operate to terminate the contract between the consumer and the Lincoln Land Company.

shall operate to terminate the company, and forfeit all money paid thereon; and the said company shall have the right to turn off the supply of water and recover damages, and in addition thereto the Lincoln Land Company may exact a penalty of one dollar before turning on the water; and the turning off of water by an agent of the said Lincoln Land Company shall be prima facle evidence of a violation of the sections of this ordinance.

SECTION 23. When water has been turned off for any cause the plumper may collect one dollar for turning water on. Section 25. Any person or persons who shall on behalf of themselves or any other persons or associations partkerships or corporations collect exact receive or charge any greater amount than is by this ordinance allowed to be charged or received from any consumer for






