Chance to Enter Civil Service.

The United States civil service commission has a requisition for a certificate to fill a vacancy in the position of fireman at \$720 per annum in the United States court house and post office building at Lincoln, Neb., and an examination will be held at the postoffice building at Omaha, Neb., commencing at 9 a. m., October 7, to which applicants from Lincoln, Neb., will be admitted to secure a list of eligibles for this and other positions in the custody of his force in this city. Applications will be accepted for the position of watchman, elevator conductor, janitor, engineer, fireman, skilled laborer, or any other position in the custodian's force. At the same time applications will be accepted for any of the mechanical trades, to establish registers from which vacancies in the service may be filled in other parts of this state or even in other parts of the country.

Persons who desire to take any of these examinations should write to the civil service commission at Washington, D. C., for application blanks and information in regard to the examinations. No person can be examined who has not previously filed an application and received an admission card.
