Channel Island Despotism.

It is not generally known that something approaching a military despotism prevails in the Channel islands. Every male adult born in Guernsey or Jersey has to serve for a long term of years in the militia, 15 years being the period in Guernsey.

In addition to this, all males of 32 years of age and under, of whatever nationality, who reside in that island for a year and a day continuously have to enter the militia and serve for 15 years, or suffer fine, imprisonment or expul-

During the last two or three years a great number of young Englishmen have settled in Guernsey to go into the tomato raising industry.

In order to avoid the military service imposed by the "states"-as the government of Guernsey is called-they make frequent trips outside their jurisdiction-either to England or to Jersey -the last named having a government independent of the rest of the Channel
