



### POPULAR SCIENCE.

A procession of icebergs sent against the surface of the sun would melt at the rate of three hundred million cubic miles of solid ice a second, and its heat is estimated to produce a force of about ten thousand-horse power to every square foot of its surface.

Of the children born alive one-fourth die before eleven months, one-third before the twenty-third month, half before their eighth year, two-thirds of mankind die before the thiry-ninth year, three-fourths before their fiftyfirst year, and of about twelve thousand only one survives a whole century.

Mr. Frank W. Very of the Ladd Observatory, Providence, R. I., has made some curious observations on the flight of migrating birds seen at night crossing the surface of the moon. He watched them with a telescope of four inches aperture, magnifying forty times. The observations were made in the latter part of September. The great majority of the birds moved from north to south, and traveled in little companies. Their average speed. as calculated by Mr. Very, was sixtyseven miles an hour, although some appeared to travel at the rate of more than one hundred miles an hour.
