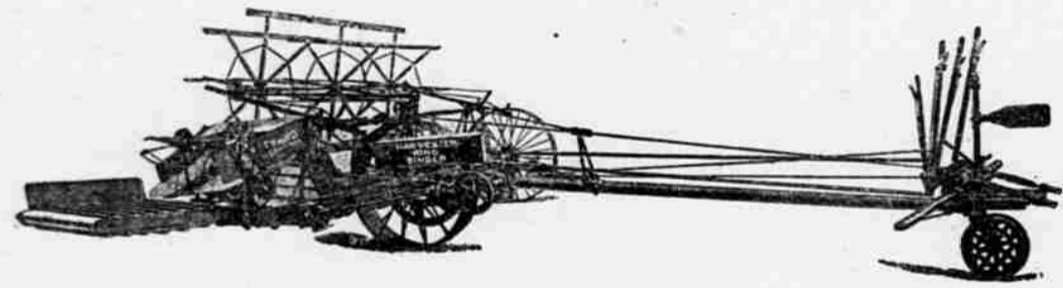

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received at the office of the county clerk of Red Willow county, Nebraska, in the city of McCook, up to one o'clock, p. m., on the 10th day of June, 1899, for finishing the commissioners' room, the county clerk's rooms, and the sheriff's office, the south stairway to the basement and to the second floor; finishing and plastering the hall-ways, including the west side of the north and south partition on the first floor, and to put in a rough floor over the rooms and hall-ways herein mentioned. Also to include finishing the vault for the county clerk's room, and putting in a partition wall of brick, eight inches thick, on the east end of the south jail room in the basement. The work to be done according to the original plans and specifications by M. Leach, architect of the court-house, and the specifications and details found in the office of the county clerk.
