ORDER OF HEARING.

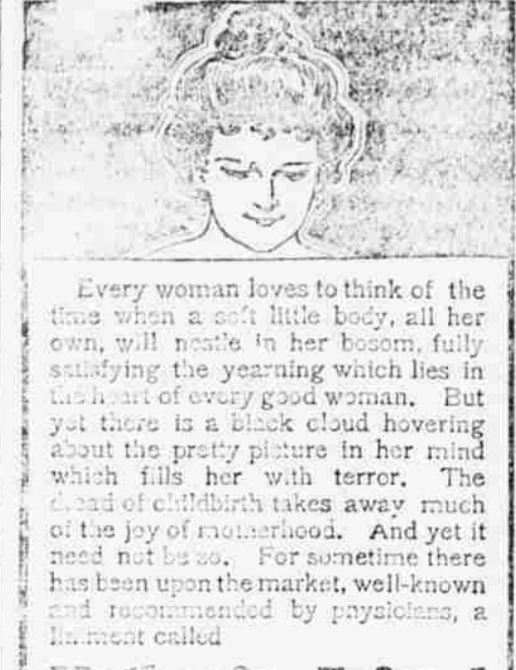
