Fastest Train on Earth.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Oct. 26 .- (Special Telegram. (-The Union Pacific will inaugurate, November 3, in connection with the Southern Pacific, Northwestern, Lake Shore and New York Central, what is claimed to be the fastest passenger train service ever adopted by any railroad in the world.

The train will be known as No. 3 and will leave Omaha, westbound, every afternoon at 4:30. It will cover the distance from Omaha to Ogeen, 1,025 miles, in twenty-one hours, the average speed of the train, exclusive of stops, being fifty-five miles an hour. In many places down grade through the mountains of Wyoming the flyer will attain a speed of sixty-five and seventy miles an hour.—Omaha Bee.


