The retirement of Justice Gray and the appointment of Judge Holmes to the bench of the supreme court will cause a rearrangement of the positions occupied by the members of the court when they meet in October.

The populist state executive committee of Georgia named Judge J. K. Hines of Atlanta for governor. Judge Hines, however, declined to run, and a committee of three was thereupon named to make a nomination.

What appears to be a forerunner of a determined effort to stop American commercial invasion of European markets is on foot in Berlin. The leading ship owners and iron masters of Germany will meet August 15 and on subsequent Fridays to discuss the matter.

At Seattle, Wash., J. M. Kidney, an employe of the Stetson-Post mill, was burned to death in a roaring furnace. used to consume waste paper. While in an epileptic fit he seized a wire conveyor cable and was dragged more than 400 feet to the furnace. His charred body was later recovered.

Wong Yen, a Chinaman recently arrested for entering the United States in violation of the immigration laws, committed suicide at Toledo, Ohio, in the county jail by hanging himself with strips torn from a sheet. Yong Yen was occupied in smuggling his fellow countrymen across the border.

The Illinois auxiliary of the McKinley Memorial association reported that the fund of \$50,000 asked of the people of Illinois had been raised. The fund consists of over fifty thousand subscriptions and, counting the individual school children who sent their pennies in through schools, the contributors in Illinois run into the hundreds of thousands.

One of the most important provisions of the British-China treaty was that abolishing the Likin tax. It is presumed that similar rates are made in the American treaty, and that the Likin tax is abolished as far as it relates to American goods in transit. The Likin tax has been one of the most burdensome exactions of the antiquated Chinese systems, as it was, levied by the officials at various points through the interior, without uniformity, and often with less regard for commercial ends than for the enrichment of the unscrupulous local of-

ficials. The abolition of the Likin tax will go far toward encouraging foreign trade and traffic in the interior of China.

Mr. Sherretts' dispatch is dated at Shanghai, and does not go into details regarding the treaty he has signed.

GALA RECEPTION TO TAFT.

Elaborate Ovation to Be Tendered Governor on Arrival.

MANILA, Aug. 1.-Governor Taft is expected to reach here next Wednesday. He left Singapore, Straits Settlements, last Friday on board the United States gunboat General Alava.

The plans for the reception to be given Governor Taft are most elaborate. The shipping in the harbor will be decorated when he arrives and a processsion of small craft is to accompany the General Alava up the bay. A series of arches are at present being erected along the line of Governor Taft's march from the office of the captain of the port, where he will disembark from a launch, to Valacanan palace, where a reception will be given him. There will be a banquet the evening of the governor's arrival.

It is called "Vaughan's justice party," and first saw the light of day at Washington. "Our party of justice is already an aggressive force," said Mr. Vaughan. "It promises liberty for all Americans. Liberty is unknown in this country. The new party opposes all trusts and monopolies. I'am in New York for the purpose of arranging for the holding of a convention here of our party of justice at an early date."

Pope Receives a Message.

ROME, Aug. 18 .- Among the telegrams of congratulation received by the pontiff was one of 20,000 words from the Catholics of Catania, Sicily, The receipt of this long message caused amusement, as under the settlement with the Italian government all telegrams for the vatican are accepted and delivered free. In the course of a conversation the pope urged the building of a chapel to be dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

One Thousand Rebels Slain. PEKIN, Aug. 18 .- The viceroy of Sze Chuan reports that imperial troops attacked the rebel headquarters at Inchawan August 12. One thousand rebels were killed and their leader, Tong You Hung, was captured and executed.
