His election comes by a plurality unprecedented in the history of the district, carrying every county in the district but Gosper, which his opponent carried by but ten plurality. The vote from the western counties of the district is especially strong. Of the appended pluralities all are official but Frontier and Chase counties, from which the information is reliable:
