Death to cattle from cornstalks may be prevented by giving one pint of salt containing three tablespoonfuls of turpentine. This should be dissolved in three pints of water and given in a drenching bottle. Even after the animal is down and unable to walk, it can be relieved in 30 minutes and in the end permanently cured. After giving the drench, rub one-half pint of turpentine on the animal just behind the shoulder, on both sides, and then along the neck veins from the jaw to the brisket. This will promptly relax the nervous system. The salt will immediately penetrate the dry husks in the stomach while the turpentine entering the blood will counteract the nerve trouble produced by the congestion of husks therein.—Ex.
