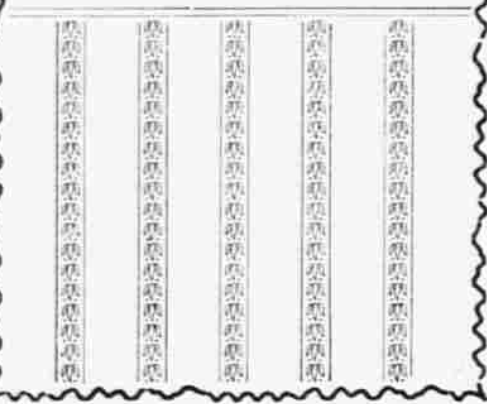

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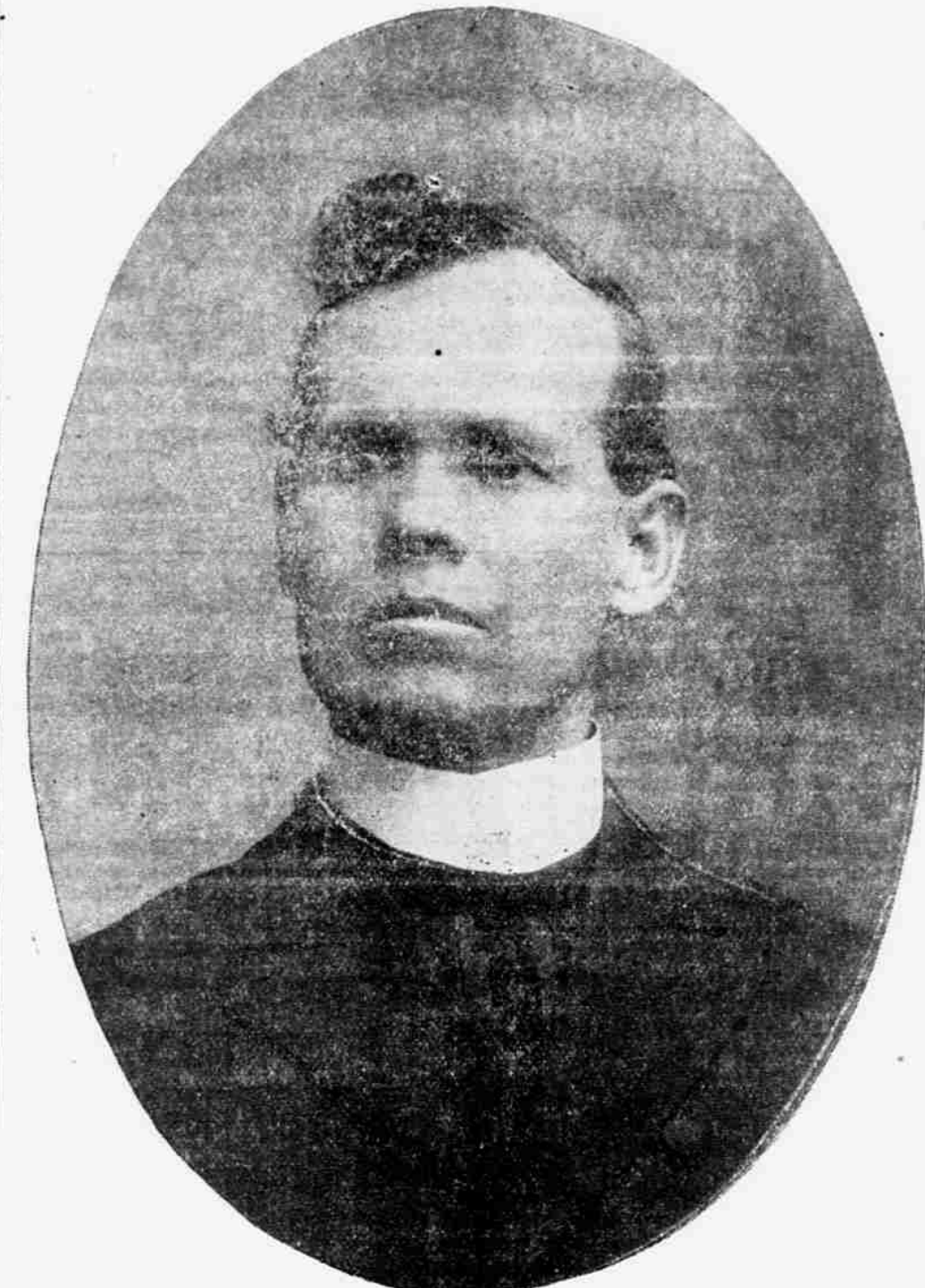

The first organization of the church society was effected by Rev. A. J. Fanning of Illinois, (who was visiting in Nebraska at the time) in the fall of 1882. After two years' service he was succeeded by Rev. James Cleary of Orleans, who was assisted by Rev. P. Brophy, in a short pastorate, and was followed by Rev. Thomas Cullen in 1885. He spent a number of successful years here and was succeeded by Rev. J. W. Hickey under whom the church property was much improved and the membership built up. A brief pastorate of Rev. J. Daly was followed by Rev. J. J. Loughran's advent.

The June School Apportionment.

The state of Nebraska will in June apportion the largest amount ever distributed among the school districts of the state. The total sum to be apportioned is \$443,000. The amount to each person between the ages of 5 and 21 is \$1.18. There are 376,317 persons of school age in the state. Red Willow county will receive \$4,021.57.

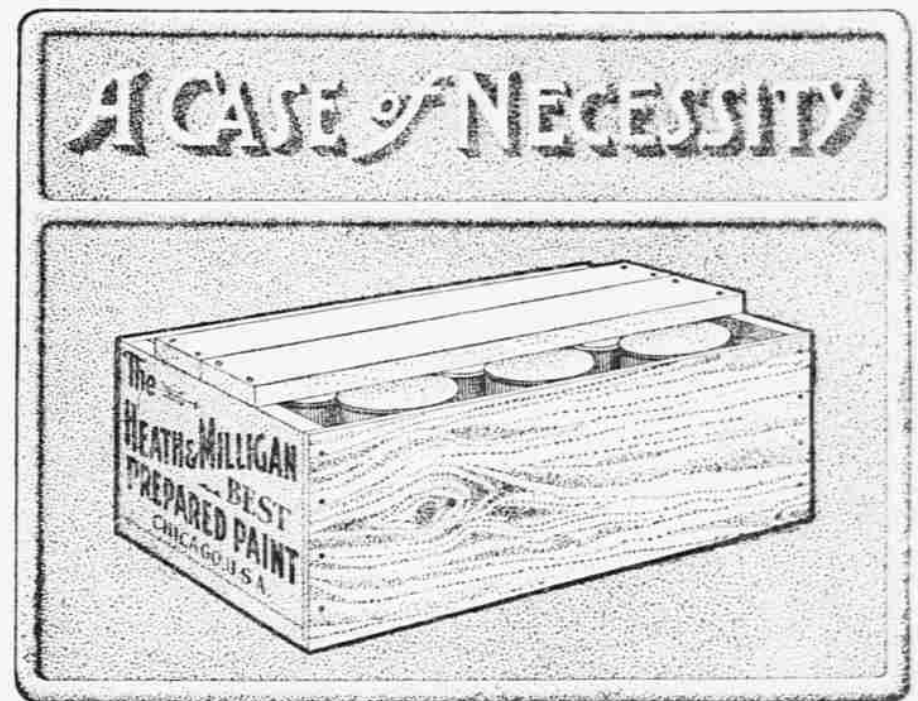
