ORDINANCE NO. 120.

An ordinance to provide a system of sewerage for the city of McCook, Red Willow county, Nebraska, prescribing the manner of organizing sewer districts; the construction of sewerage works and the assessment and levy of special taxes to pay for construction thereof. Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the city of McCook:

SECTION ONE.
The mayor and city council having ordered that a survey be made with estimates and calculations necessary for the establishment of a sewerage system for the city of McCook, Nebraska, together with the costs of labor and material for the construction of the main and principal sewer, and having employed C. H. Meeker, a special city engineer for that purpose and such special engineer having made such survey and estimate, a report of which he has submitted to the city council, and is now on file in the office of the city clerk, including, surveys, maps, plans, specifications, profiles and estimates which are incorporated into and are made a part of the record in the city clerk's office.

SECTION TWO.
That the complete system of sewerage contained in the surveys, maps, profiles, plans, specifications and estimates submitted by C. H. Meeker, special engineer, be and the same are hereby adopted by the city of McCook.

SECTION THREE.
The main or principal sewerage that will be built by the city of McCook will begin at the alley west of McFarland street on North Railroad street, running thence east on North Railroad street to the intersection of Manhattan street; thence south along the county road to the Republican river. Also on Dover street, beginning at the intersection in the alley between Main Avenue and Marshall street, running thence east along Dover street to the intersection in the alley between Monroe and Monmouth streets; also on Dudley street, commencing at the intersection of the alley between Monroe and Monmouth streets, running thence east along Dudley street to the intersection of the alley between Monmouth and Melvin streets.

SECTION FOUR.
Sewer districts may be organized and lateral or district sewers may be constructed upon a petition therefor, purporting to be signed by the owners of at least one half of the real estate in such district, subject to assessment therefor as shown by the deed records of Red Willow county and presented to the city council, which, if regular, shall be allowed whenever a petition for any such sewer has been allowed by the city council of the city of McCook. The city engineer or assistant engineer is hereby authorized to draw plans and specifications of the said sewer and make an estimate of the cost thereof and submit them to the city council. The city clerk shall at once advertise for bids for the construction of said sewer in accordance with said plans and specifications, reserving the right to reject any and all bids, providing any such bids shall be made by a responsible bidder, and is within the estimate of the city engineer or assistant engineer, provided that there be no responsible bidder or all bids are rejected the city shall re-advertise.

SECTION FIVE.
Special taxes may be levied by the mayor and council of the city of McCook for the purpose of constructing lateral or district sewers within the city of McCook. Such taxes to be levied on the real estate lying and being within the sewerage district in which such sewer is being constructed, to the extent of the benefits to such property to be determined by the council sitting as a board of equalization, after notice of such sitting shall have been published for at least three consecutive weeks in some newspaper published in such city. In cases where the council, sitting as such board of equalization, shall find such benefits to be equal and uniform, such levy may be according to the front foot of the lots of real estate within such sewerage district, and according to the same rule as the council, sitting as a board of equalization, may adopt for the distribution of adjustment of such cost, upon the lot or real estate in such districts benefited by such sewerage, and such taxes or assessments made for sewerage or drainage purposes shall be collected in the same manner as other taxes of the city of McCook are collected. When sewers are constructed and any assessment to cover the cost thereof shall be declared void, or doubts exist as to the validity of such assessment, the mayor and council, for the purpose of paying the cost of such improvement, are hereby authorized and empowered to make a re-assessment of such costs on the lots or real estate lying and being within the sewerage district in which any such sewer may be situated to the extent of the benefits of such property to be determined by the council sitting as a board of equalization, and such re-assessment shall be made in the manner provided for making original assessments of like nature as herein provided, and any sums which may have been paid toward such improvements, upon any lots or real estate included in such re-assessment, shall be applied under the direction of the council to the credit of the persons and property on account of which the same was paid, and in case the credit shall exceed the sum re-assessed against such persons and property as herein provided, the council shall cause such excess, with lawful interest to be refunded to the party that made payment thereof, and the taxes so re-assessed, and not paid under a prior assessment shall be collected and enforced in the same manner as other taxes of the city, and shall be subject to the same penalties as herein provided. Whenever such special taxes are levied the city clerk shall forthwith deliver certified copy of such resolution to county clerk who shall place the same upon the tax list to be collected the same way as other city taxes. Provided that any sewer district that has been constructed may be enlarged and extended in the same manner and the same proceedings had as is herein required for the formation and construction of sewer districts.

SECTION SIX.
This ordinance to take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
