REVERSED, REMANDED

The

Supreme Court Reverses Itself and the District Court.

SUIT IS TO BE RE-TRIED

There Have Been Already Two Trials in the District Court and Two Supreme Court Decisions.

A decision of more than passing inte rest to the city of McCook was rendered by the supreme court of the state of Nebraska at its sitting, close of last week, when a reversal was recorded by the court in the case of James McAdams versues The City of McCook, for damages, the case being carried up to the higher court by the city, which lost its case in the trial in district court.

This case has had quite a checkered career. Its first appearance in district court was October, 1901, but it did not come to trial until October term 1902, when the city won the suit. The case went up to the supreme court and was reversed and remanded for retrial.

The second trial in the court below occurred in the October 1904 term, when the plaintiff James McAdams was Roy Zint. given the verdict by the jury. The city appealed from this decision again to the supreme court. Close of last week, the court above reversing itself and the last verdict from the district court, remanding the case to the district court for retrial.
