PUBLIC LIBRARY NOTES.

Charles Reade was born in Ipeden, England, in 1814, and died on April 11th, 1884. After leaving Oxford in 1835, he studied law and was called to the bar in 1843. Soon afterwards he resolved to devote himself to literature. He published his first novel in 1852. This was "Peg Woffington," and its success was so unqualified that, if the author had any doubts concerning his wisdom in changing his profession they were soon dispelled. Among his subsequent novels were: "It is Never too late to Mend," "The Cloister and the Hearth," "Hard Cash," "Foul Play," "Put Yourself in His Place," and "A Terrible Temptation."

Most of the novels of Charles Reade had to do with certain social and legal abuses then existing in England, and they did much to effect a pronounced improvement in the conditions attacked. Reade was scarcely less successful as a dramatist than as a novelist. Several of his plays were written in collaboration with Tom Taylor and Dion Boucicault. "The Box Tunnel," which may be found at the library in magazine form, was written in 1857. It is an excellent specimen of that peculiar quality of humor for which his gifted author was famous.
