### City Council Takes Action.

At the regular session of the city council, Monday evening, the members passed upon the proposition of the Burlington agent the crossing matter. The council agreed to accept the company's proposition to place a crossing at the foot of Manhattan street, provided the company maintained the same. As to the crossing about a half mile east of the Manhattan street crossing, the council took no action on the ground it was outside their jurisdiction and a proper subject for action upon the part of the county commissioners. THE TRIBUNE believes the company will eventually acquiesce in the wisdom of placing the crossing at the present and old location and that they will maintain the same—thus bringing to a close a disturbing incident in an entirely satisfactory manner.
