ORDINANCE NO. 134.

An ordinance amending section 23 of ordinance No. 62, providing for the election, appointment and compensation of city officers, etc., passed and approved February 4, 1905, and to repeal said original section.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of McCook, Nebraska:

Sec. 1. That section No. 23 of ordinance No. 62 of the book of ordinances of the City of McCook, passed and approved on the 4th day of February, 1905, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2. The officers shall receive the following salaries and fees and to more:

Mayor, seventy-five dollars (\$75.00).
Each councilman, fifty dollars (\$50.00).
City clerk, one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00).
Treasurer, fifty dollars, (\$50.00).
City attorney, one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
Engineer, four dollars (\$4.00) per day for each day's actual service and not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300.00).
Chief of police, sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per month.
Night police, sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per month.

The chief of police shall also perform the duties of constable of streets.

Sec. 2. That said original section 23 of ordinance 62, passed and approved February 4, 1905, is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance to take effect from and after passage and publication.

Passed and approved April 8, 1907.
