### REVOLUTIONARY MEMORIES.

Their Revival In the Dedication of the Fort Lee Monument.

The monument at Fort Lee, N. J. which was unveiled a short time ago marks another step in the movement for preservation of the picturesque Palisades of the Hudson, and it serves also to perpetuate the memories connected with the romantic history of this beautiful region. At the unveiling ceremonies George W. Perkins, president of the commission in charge of the Palisades Interstate park, made the announcement that a half million dollars has now been expended in the at Rozell & Barger's. creation of the park and all of the Palisades and river front from Fort Lee to Nyack have now been purchased for it except one or two parcels, the title for which will be in the commission's hands by next year.
