THE M'COOK WATERWORKS

The Plant Described—Outgrown and Inadequate in Every Way.

The great and far famed McCook waterworks consist of the following items, to-wit:

3 Deane steam pumps made 27 years ago.

6 wells dug at various times from 1883 on.

2,200 feet of 12 inch main pipe to 1st street, used 27 years.

8 812 feet of 6 inch street pipe used 27 years.

13,200 feet of 4 inch street pipe used 27 years.

37,285 feet of 3 inch street pipe used 27 years.

1 standpipe used 16 years.

Mr. Darrow, the civil engineer in the employ of the H. & M. R. Co., was called as an expert witness by the water company in its case against the city. In answer to the questions of the city's attorneys he testified that 3 inch water pipe is worthless for fire protection. What that means to McCook is seen in the following facts:

The big 3 story Palmer hotel has no water main within 2 blocks of it larger than 3 inches.

The whole of West McCook is cut there on the end of a 3 inch pipe that goes 3 000 feet before it reaches the fire house in West McCook.

The big brick school house in the east end is located between 2 streets that have nothing but 3 inch pipe along their entire length.

The entire residence section lying east and south of the Catholic church does not contain a water pipe larger than 3 inches.

Such water pipe ought never to have been laid even for a village like McCook was 27 years ago. To regard it as adequate for the present city of 5,000 people is to forget everything bearing on suitability.

Such a plant cannot be expanded for the increasing needs of the city. The little 3 inch squirt pipes are right in the heart of the town and must be dug up and replaced before extensions to outlying districts can be made.

In its communication to the city council submitted in writing on the 3rd day of May, 1907 the water company says: "At least 3 per cent should be allowed for depreciation yearly." If that rate of depreciation be figured on the plant from the time it was installed to the present time there remains but 19 per cent of its original value. Considering the total inadequacy of the plant to the protection and needs of the city, that per cent probably exceeds its value to the city.

Yet the company's hope to this day is to hoodwink, cajole, intimidate or tease the city into taking over the old mill-plant with its outworn and outgrown machinery and all, for the sum of \$75,000.00.
