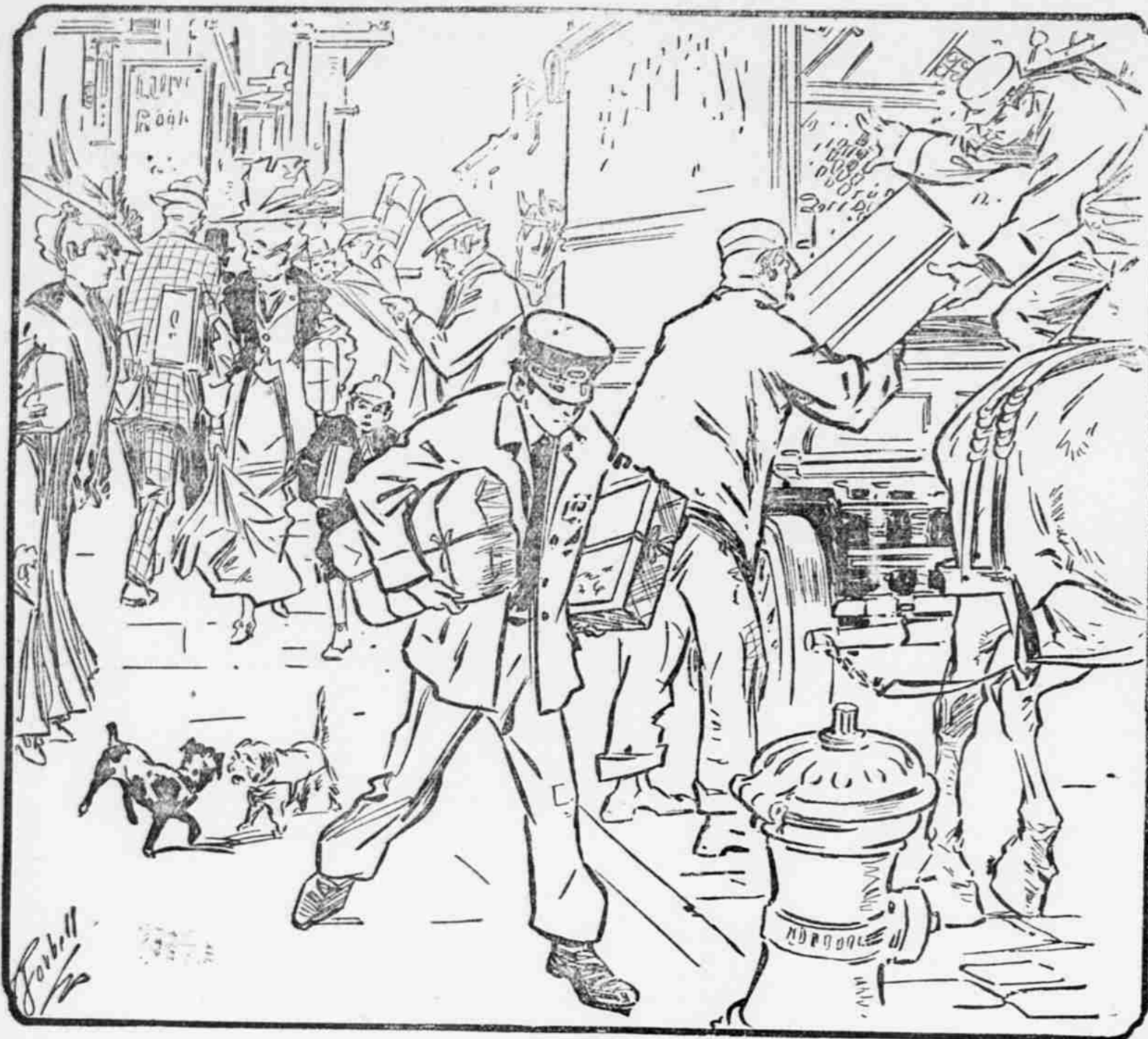

Which filled them with surprise,

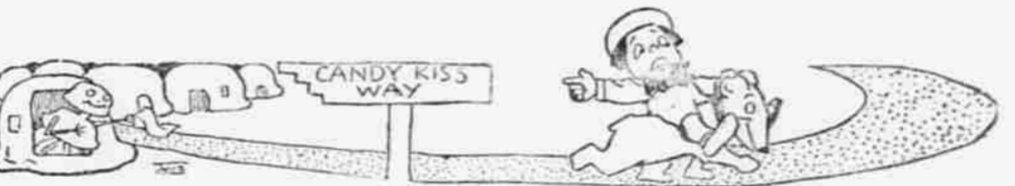


For every shop was a chocolate drop

I'll finish up today!"

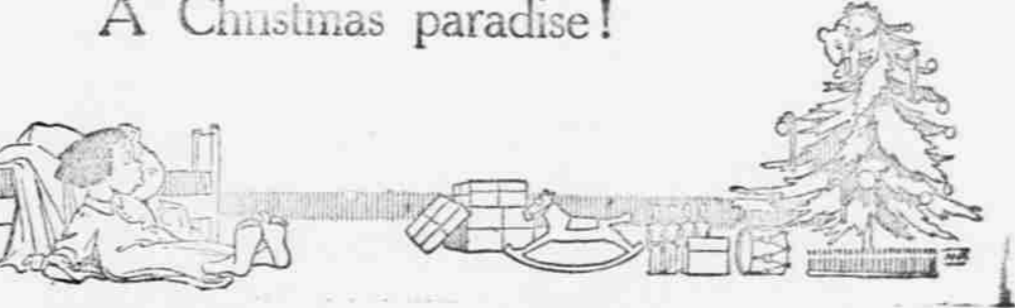
That Teddy bear plugged straight along
