State Taxes Less.

The total amount of state taxes charged against the several counties in 1909 and 1910 are respectively \$2,194,421.95 and \$2,059,842.70, or \$134,572.25 less this year than last. In 1909 Red Willow county was charged \$18,179.16; this year the figures are \$16,745.90, or a reduction of \$1,433.26. The amount of state taxes is based on a 5-mill levy. Total valuation is less in 1910.

It is possible that the world's future supply of paper pulp will be derived from the bamboo forests of the tropics instead of being drawn from the forests of the temperate zones.
