The claim of E. A. Sexton of \$100 on sw of 3-3-28, by reason of vacation of road No. 13, was on motion rejected.

The petition of Jacob Swartz, I. M. Beardslee and others, asking for the establishment of a public road, was read and considered. A motion was made by Lofton, seconded by Sughroue, that the road as petitioned for by Jacob Swartz and others, be granted and road established as follows:

Commencing at the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section 19, township 2, range 30, running thence south 1/4 of a mile to the southeast corner of section 19, thence west on section line 3/4 of a mile to a point 80 rods east of the county line, thence south on quarter of a mile line (80 rods east of county line) two miles, terminating at the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 31-2-30, except that in section 30 the road shall be far enough west of the road as petitioned to avoid all canyons, road to follow the line as petitioned as far as practicable.

The roll call was ordered and resulted as follows: Lofton, Sughroue, Gray—3. Motion declared carried unanimously, said new road to be known as road No. 433, and the clerk was instructed to notify overseer of highways to open said road.

The board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Present: C. B. Gray, F. S. Lofton and Edward Sughroue, county commissioners, and Chas. Skalla, county clerk.

A motion was made by Lofton that R. M. Osborn be appointed as constable for Willow Grove precinct, to fill vacancy. The roll call was ordered and resulted as follows: Yea: Lofton, Gray—2. Nay: Sughroue—1. Motion was declared carried.

The official bond of R. M. Osborn as constable for Willow Grove precinct was examined and on motion approved and ordered recorded and placed on file.

A motion was made by Lofton, seconded by Sughroue, that the county attorney be instructed to collect from Dund county the sum of \$50.84, being for the attendance and care of Howard Perkins, small pox patient, a resident of Dund county. Motion carried unanimously.

The board concluded the examination of the accounts of J. C. Moore, county judge, and after a careful examination finds that he has earned as fees, from January 6, 1910, to June 30, 1910, inclusive, the sum of \$498.45. The quarterly reports of J. C. Moore, county judge, for the first and second quarters of 1910, were examined and on motion approved and ordered placed on file.

The petition of George Hoffenke and others, asking for the vacation of part of road No. 230, was read and considered. After due consideration the board finds that all owners of land along the line proposed to be vacated have given their signature thereto in writing. On motion same was granted. The vacated area is as follows:
