The board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Present: F. S. Lofton, Edward Sughrue and W. N. Rogers, county commissioners, Chas. D. Ritchie, county attorney, and Chas. Skalla, county clerk. Petitions of county officers asking for deputy and clerk hire for the year 1911 were read and considered. A motion was made by Sughrue, that the county treasurer be allowed not to exceed \$1000.00 a year, for deputy and extra clerk hire.

The roll call was ordered and resulted as follows:

Yea: Sughrue, 1; Nay: Lofton, Rogers, 2. Motion was declared lost.

The roll call was ordered and resulted as follows:

Yea: Sughrue, 1; Nay: Lofton, Rogers, 2. Motion was declared lost.

On motion the applications as petitioned for, were granted, Lofton and Rogers voting Yea, and Sughrue voting Nay. The applications, as granted, entitle the officers to the following:

C. Naden, county treasurer, one deputy at \$1,000.00 per year, extra clerk hire, if needed, at \$200.00 per year.

Chas. Skalla, county clerk, one deputy, at \$800.00 per year, one assistant, at \$540.00 per year.

Provided, always, that these amounts must be paid out of fees of office; and also provided, that the county clerk does, the same as he did in 1910, assist the county assessor in making up, booking and balancing the 1911 personal assessment books and schedules, without any extra charge to the county.

A motion was made by Rogers, seconded by Sughrue, that the salary of the county clerk, for being clerk of the board, be fixed at \$300.00 per year. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Rogers, seconded by Sughrue, that E. W. McAninch be appointed as overseer of highways for district No. 15, Driftwood precinct, to fill vacancy. Motion carried unanimously.

At the request of Chas. D. Ritchie, county attorney, the board instructed the county clerk to state in the commissioner proceedings and records the presence or absence of the county attorney at the various board meetings, the same as the members of the board.
