The board of county commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Present: F. S. Lofton, Edward Sughrue and W. N. Rogers, county commissioners; Chas. D. Ritchie, county attorney, and Chas. Skalla, county clerk.

The minutes of the meetings held March 6th, 7th and 8th were read and on motion approved.

The quarter-annually reports of C. A. Rodgers, clerk of the district court for the 3rd and 4th quarters, 1910, were examined, found correct and were on motion approved and ordered placed on file.

The clerk having advertised that sealed bids for such medical services of physicians and medicines as may be required by the poor of Red Willow county would be received by the board, the board proceeded to open the bids on file, and found the following bids filed with the clerk:

Dr. R. B. Campbell, 1st district, \$100.00 a year.

Dr. D. F. Smith, 2nd district, \$80.00 a year.

A motion was made by Sughrue, seconded by Rogers, that the board do not enter into contract with any physician, but that hereafter the justices of the peace will issue orders in each individual case, as required by law. Motion carried unanimously.

The official bond of W. T. Clark, as overseer of highways, for district No. 7, Willow Grove precinct, to fill vacancy, was examined and on motion approved and ordered recorded and placed on file.

The petition of Willard Dutton, Susan C. Hileman, and others, asking for the establishment of a public road and the vacation of a county road, was read and considered, and the clerk was instructed to make the following record:

"The board finds from their personal knowledge and view of the road proposed to be vacated and of the road proposed to be established and the evidence that the signers of the petition include the owners of all the land abutting on said road proposed to be vacated and said road proposed to be established, that it is expedient, and the public good requires that said road proposed to be vacated, be vacated, that said road proposed to be established, be established, and the board further finds generally in favor of the petitioners for said road and against the remonstrators. It is therefore on motion ordered that the petition be granted."

Voting yea on above motion: Lofton, Rogers—2; nay: Sughrue—1. The motion was declared carried.

Above order establishes the following road: "Commencing at the southeast corner of section 11, township 2, north of range 30, west 6th P. M., thence north to cross Driftwood creek 760 feet, thence southeasterly along and 5 feet from the north bank of said creek to the section line between sections 12 and 13-2-30 aforesaid, thence east along section line to meet the road running to the north quarter corner of sections 12 and 13 aforesaid. Said road to be 40 ft. wide. That part of the road to be opened running north from the S. E. corner of section 11 aforesaid to the point across the creek to be 40 feet west of the section line between sections 11 and 12 aforesaid. Said road to be known as Road No. 440, and the county clerk was instructed to notify the overseer of highways to open said road.

Above order further vacates Road No. 142 from the southwest corner of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of section 13, east one-half mile, thence north one-fourth mile to north quarter corner of section 13 aforesaid, and the county clerk was instructed to notify the overseer of highways of said vacation.
