R. F. D. No. 3. Farmers are feeling pretty good since the rain of Sunday and Monday.

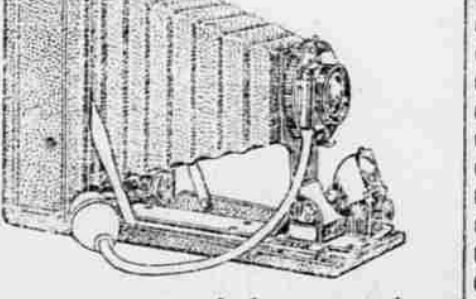
John Randal is building some fence. M. Austin is fencing in a new pasture.

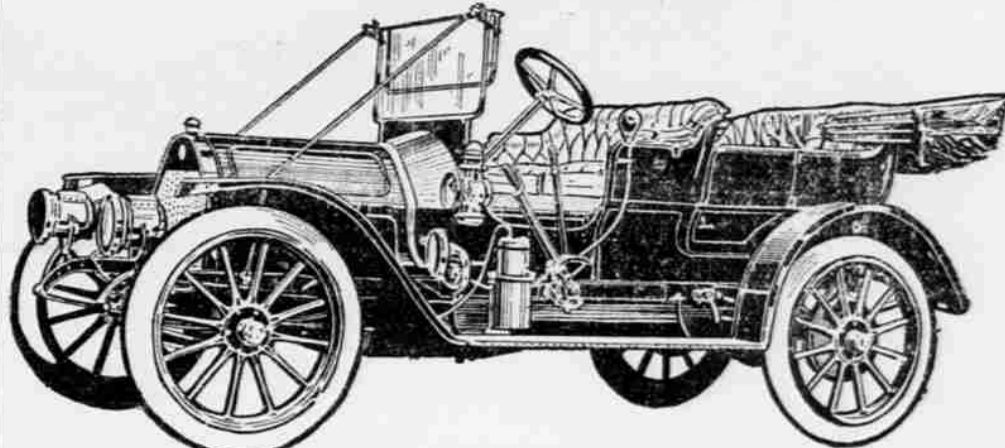
