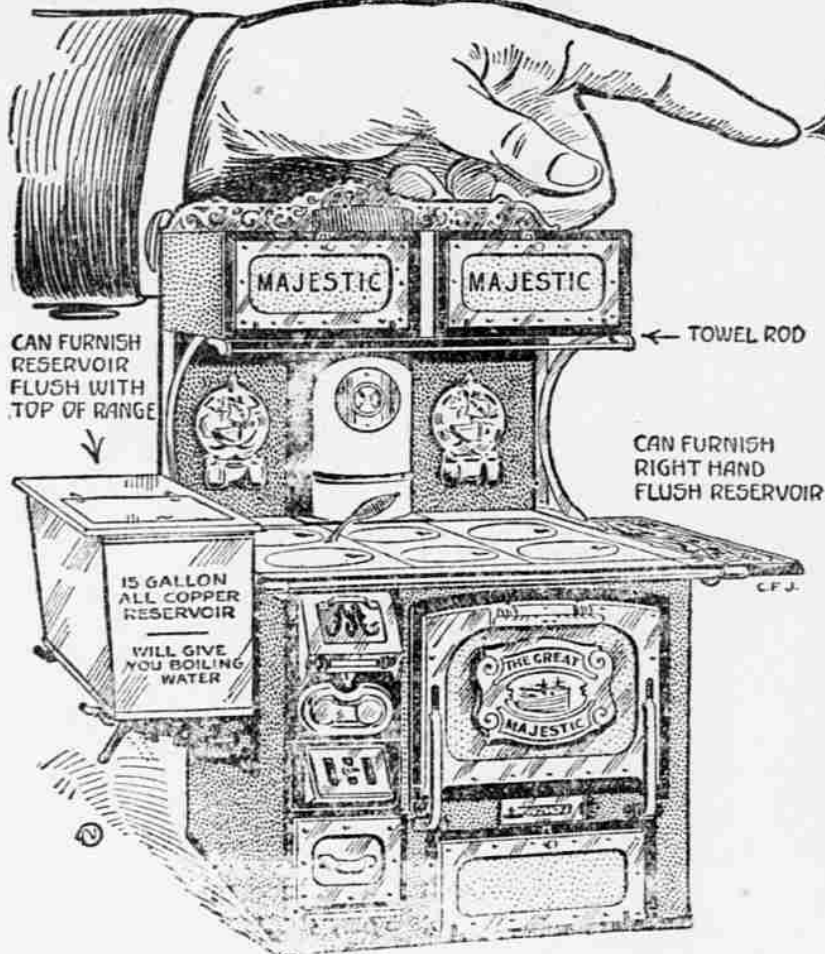

Barton Files for Congress.

Silas R. Barton, the state auditor, Wednesday, filed nomination papers as a candidate for congress in the Fifth district. He filed his personal request with the secretary of state to have his name placed on the ballot to be used at the primary election, April 15, 1912.

While Mr. Barton feels that he is none too early in the race, he is the second to file nomination papers as a candidate for congress. Paul F. Clark of Lincoln beat him in point of time, but Mr. Clark is a candidate in the First district. Mr. Barton, like Mr. Clark, says he affiliates with the Republican party, and that he desires his name on the republican primary ballot. He has paid the usual \$10 filing fee in Hall county, which is the county of his legal residence.

W. A. Prince of Grand Island, also a republican, has announced that he will be a candidate at the primaries. It is rumored that Dr. L. A. Andrews of Holdrege may get into the race as a republican.

On the democratic side it is probable that Bernard McMenny of Red Cloud and ex-Congressman Sutherland of Nelson, may be candidates. It is not improbable, according to politicians, to see C. E. Harmon, defeated democratic candidate for railway commissioner, to enter the congressional race. Lincoln State Journal.

A NOVEL NEW SUIT.

A smart suit made of corduroy or of Scotch or English suiting mixtures, has no equal for serviceability, and here is a strikingly becoming and stylish way to make one. The suit is made of a single-breasted jacket on the Norfolk order, modified in several effective and original ways,



and a divided or a "Pantalon" skirt, that has a loose panel at the front and back to practically conceal the division. A more comfortable walking skirt cannot well be imagined; yet its appearance is that of a regulation trotter model of the latest cut. It is four-gored, and the waistline may be either high or round style; as to trimming, the possibilities are of course limited in this kind of a suit—limited to buttons and contrasting materials. That is, if a mixed suiting be used, the sailor collar may be of solid color velvet, with cuffs to match; or for a corduroy suit, whether of a single dark color, or in a two-tone weave, white corduroy may be used for the collar and cuffs. Rough woollens are good style too for a suit of this type.
