Word has been received here of the serious illness of Leo Dolan of Los Angeles, California.

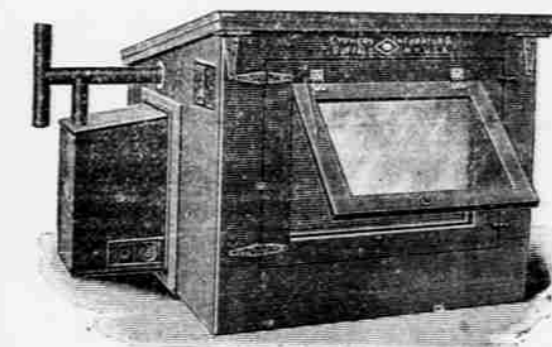
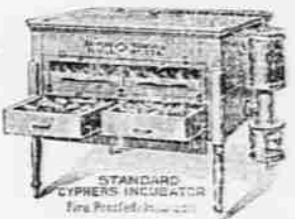
