#### Nutting.

The old device of jarring by a heavy stone the tree bole-especially the slim secondary trees of the deeper woods—may be trite, but not its refinement of taking a somewhat smaller stone and by a series of quick taps on the trunk "snapping" the upper branches Less known and more effective is another plan. Its elements are a good arm, a ball of strong cord. and, attached, a half-pound stone. more or less, according to the weight of the string. The theory involves the casting of a weight over a bough of the nut tree and shaking it briskly when looped by many a youngster who deems him self a cracker thrower on the ball field will find some lessons to be learned in the precison of "loop ing" a chestnut branch and in the retarding power of an ascending cord tied to a projectile. Again with usage comes the art of so releasing the cord from an upper bough as to loop the bough below and, with acquired dexterity strip half a dozen branches after a single cast.—Outing.
