The annual class sermon was delivered on Sunday morning at the Presbyterian church by Rev. Bert Wilson, the class attending in a body.

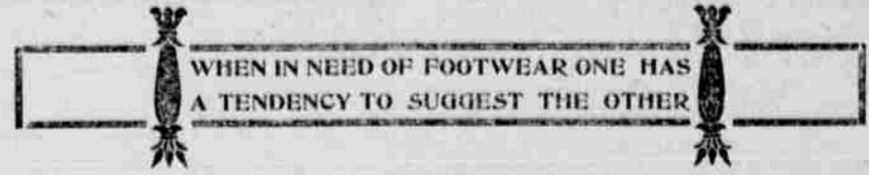
Frank Snethen has purchased the Grinstead property near the Baptist church and will soon begin the erection of a new residence thereon.
