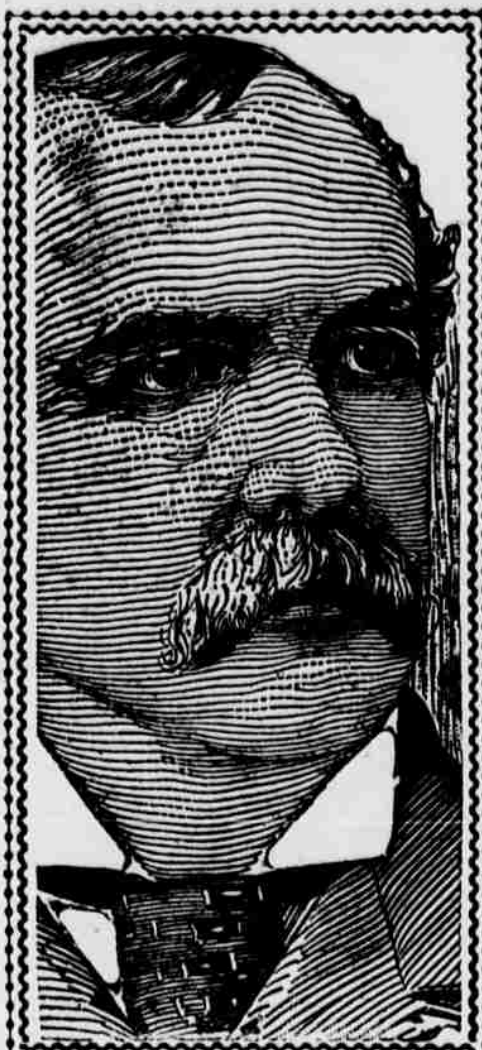


A UNITED STATES SENATOR
