The parent of any child not attending school according to the terms set fourth above should have a notice from the director. If this notice is not complied with within one week, then it is the director to make complaint before the justice and the parent shall be fined no less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars. In case the director fails to perform his duties he lays himself liable to a fine in the same amount.
