## R. E. Grinstead on Drainage Matters

Chapter 89, Art. 2, Revised statutes of Neb. provide the method by which, a drainage district may be established; the same also sets out the duties of county boards, made and provided in such cases; amongst which is that when a number of financially responsible citizens shall place before them a grood and sufficient bond and petition, it becomes their duty to order a survey made by a competent engineer prescribing the duties of the engineer. to wit; that he shall calculate the area of all the lands to be benefitted, and that heshall estimate the probable cost and damage to every land owner within the given drainage district and that the county board shall, as a loan to the drainage district from the county general fund pay for this surver whet: satisfactorily finished and charge the same up to the drainage district and at the following June meeting of the board make alevy against the lands of the drainage district sufficient in amount to reimburse the county general funds and the same must be done without delay just as the same is always done in other matters of the different depatments of county affairs. According to the provisions of this law a petition and bonds representing seventy five owners of swamp or wet latds, and aggregate wealth of more than one million dollars and asking them tor a favorable consideration of the same. On a motion of a member of the board the matter was postponed until next January. These petitions, and bondsmen sought for only what is provided for in the law, and what has been asked for and granted under the same chapter and article by the various county boards of Dakota, Dodge, Burt, Washington and Douglas coun-
