Mr. Margrave came up from the ranch Tuesday.

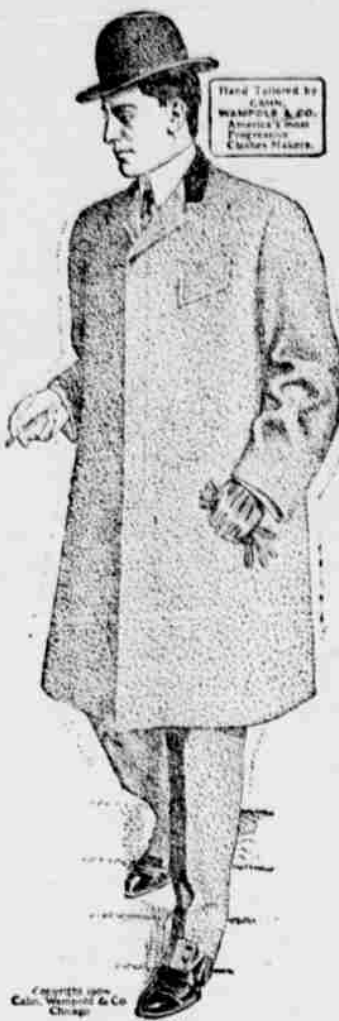
