### A. N. Glenn Dead.

A. N. Glenn died at his home in this city Sunday night at the age of 65 years, 3 months and 26 days, of pneumonia after an illness of a few weeks.

Addison N. Glenn was born in Gallia County, Ohio, September 16 1839. At the outbreak of the civil war he enlisted as a private, and September 1, 1862, was promoted to 5th sergeant, and on May 4, 1863 was again promoted to second lieutenant, and again on January 1, 1864 to first lieutenant in Co. M, of the engineer corps. He was discharged at Atlanta, Ga. October 31, 1864, after having been in all the engagements in which his company took part.

Mr. Glenn had lived in this city for a number of years formerly being in the implement business, but of late years had been on the retired list. He had many warm friends to learn of his demise. Short funeral services were held at the M. E. church Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock, conducted by the pastor, Rev. W. T. Cline, after which the body was shipped to Mound City, Mo., for burial.

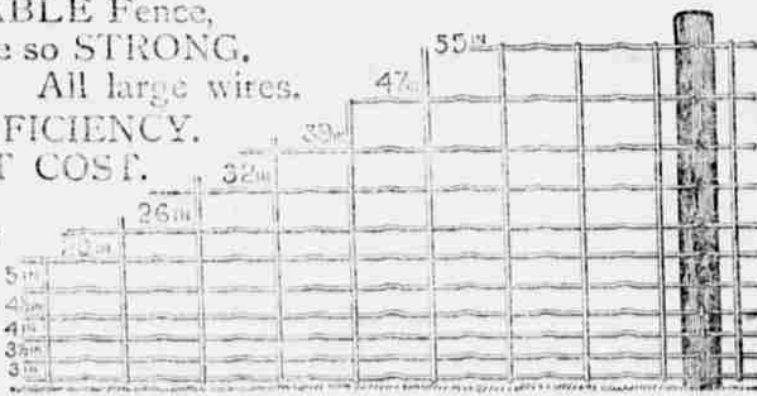
