This corporation is hereby empow ered to own, buy and sell real estate o exchange the same when necessary or advisable to the proper conduct or mainte nance of its park or improvement business

ART, IV The authorized capital stock of this corporation shall be Twenty Thousand Dollars of which the sum of Fifty-live Hundred Dollars shall be fully paid up when these articles are filed with the county clerk. The stock shall be divided into shares of the fall par value of Fifty

Dollars each and shall be non-assessable. ART, V. The greatest amount of indebt edness to which this corporation shall a any time subject itself shall not exceed two-thirds of the paid up capital stock. ART. VI-The date of commencement of

the corporation shall be immediately upon clerk of Richardson county, Nebraska, and It shall terminate fifty years thereafter unless sooner dissolved by vote of two

ART. VII-The affairs of the corporation
