Now and Then.

The fact that the Falls City Journal had a representative before the Gage county board of supervisors at the letting of the annual bridge contract last week is even smaller and meaner than we thought the outfit was capable of. John Martin was in Beatrice with copies of the Journal containing its scandalous and lying attacks on the Gilligan company, and he saw that these papers reached the hands of those who were in authority. The result was that while the board sized the young fellow up at his value, the home company lost the contract. The profit on the years work will go to a little town in Iowa, to be spent with the merchants, the laborers and the various other businesses. It might have come to Falls City. It would have been spent here had it come. We know of no other community that is cursed with such a gang. From the very day these people secured the management of this paper down until this hour there has been turmoil and strife. The town row dated from the first issue of the Journal under the Martin management. Every dollar spent with this paper is used against their personal enemies. They appeal for patronage from local advertisers and newspaper readers, yet they even send abroad for their stamps because they don't like Jack Crook. They would not only prefer to see their opponents destroyed than prosper, but they use every means within their power to keep up trouble and prevent people from making a living though their efforts injure the city as a whole. They complain that the people don't support the Journal, while as a matter of fact if the Journal got it's just deserts every loyal citizen would absolutely withdraw his patronage. We know of no one thing that has caused the unfavorable and bitter comment that young Martin's conduct in Beatrice last week has caused.

For Falls City to reach its highest development it must have industries that will bring foreign money here. For a merchant to buy advertising of a newspaper and the newspaper to spend the money with the merchant don't make Falls City any richer, because we are doing business with money already here. But for the Vinegar factory to buy apples of the farmer and sell its vinegar in St. Louis does help the town because every gallon of vinegar sold in St. Louis brings in a few cents of foreign money and adds just that much to the wealth of Falls City. For every contract the Gilligan company gets abroad the profits of which are brought to Falls City and here expended adds just that much to the wealth of Falls City because it brings foreign money here that would other-

wise go some where else. If the Gilligan company had been given the Gage county contract and had made a thousand dollars on it say, the thousand dollars at the end of the year would have found its way into the channels of Falls City trade. As it is, young Martin has diverted this thousand dollars to a small town in Iowa and has, as a result mdae Falls City just that much poorer. Yet, he wails Falls City doesn't support the Journal as it should. The Journal should apply to the Iowa town for support. It wouldn't take much increase in the post office business to raise the salary of the postmaster to give him an additional clerk and put on a carrier system employing three men, yet the Journal buys every dollar of its post-office supplies away from Falls City. Still, they wail, we are a local institution and we are not appreciated. Falls City needs harmony but it will never get it as long as the Journal is in the hands of the malicious, selfish, egotistical crowd that now manage it.

We do not say these things from the pleasure we derive in saying them. We would much prefer to speak of the Journal not at all. We speak of it from the necessity of the occasion and because we believe the general public is entitled to know just what meanness and littleness will and is doing. The Tribune and the News have never failed to do everything in their power to build up Falls City. The columns of these papers are open to anything that will foster and encourage home institutions. But of what avail are efforts of this kind when opposed to them is the maliciousness and the destructive desires of a third paper. The Journal has always pretended that its fight on the Gilligan company was inspired by its love of the tax payers. Of course but very few people are blind enough to believe any such statement. The record of the crowd is too well known. But it would be interesting to know what interested Johnny Martin has in the Gage county tax payers that would inspire him with his little bundle of papers to fight and oppose a home institution as he did in Beatrice last week.

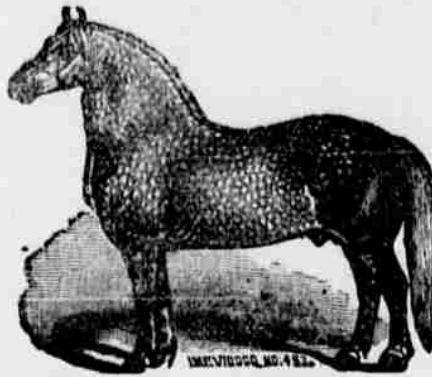
