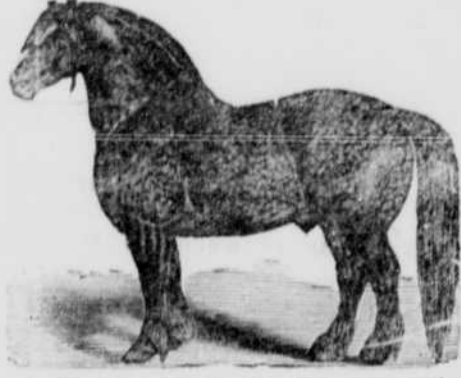


TOM-FRITZ-DECK
