THE NEW CABINET SWORN IN AT NOON

Gorgeous Ceremonies Attended the Mexico Function.

DIAZ SEEMS IN GOOD HEALTH

This is the First Time in the Nation's History That a Ministry Has Been Pledged to Reform.

Mexico City, Mar. 29.—In the royally ornate hall of Ambassadors in the National Palace, members of the new cabinet were sworn in at noon. An aisle way was formed by a double row of high military officers in gorgeous ceremonial uniforms. At one end stood President Diaz and a subsecretary. The latter administered the oath of office.

Escorted by two generals each minister was ushered into the further end of the military peristyle areway and advancing, bowed formally three times, the last genuflection bringing him face to face with the battleship prowlike countenance of the president. At the conclusion of the oath the ministers would say: "I protest that I will do my duty" and the president replied to each, "If you do the people will approve; if you do not, the people will condemn."

The President Vigorous. Gen. Diaz, looking not over 60, spoke in a firm, distinct voice and gazed fixedly, with impassive face at

each minister. Immediately after the ceremony the ministers went to their respective offices and began their duties.

A noticeable incident was the presence of the Americans and not a word or look conveyed any resentment or hostility. Extreme politeness was evident. The president's face was entirely free from any wrinkle of anxiety and appeared exactly as potently serene as when seen a year ago.

Physically he looked his ability to put any three men in the room over his shoulder.

People Not Excited. There was no sign of excitement among the people. All who could gain admittance to the hall, crowded in and several hundred stood quietly in front of the palace during the ceremony.

This is the first time in Mexico's history of the induction of a cabinet pledged to radical reforms demanded by both the peaceful citizens and a large number of revolutionaries.

Senor Limantour was present but was not sworn as his resignation had not been accepted. When he entered the hall there was a rubbering and whispering showing his possession of the center of the stage. Limantour has become notable in the American fashion and shops advertise Limantour cigars, Limantour collars, Limantour shirts and Limantour more intimate and bashful garments. It is evident that in his cameo-like head he carries either the renaissance or the ruin of Mexico.

Corroboration of Gen. Diaz's intention to quit as soon as he can do so without appearing to act under compulsion was received from a friend who quotes the president as saying to him that as soon as the reform program is instituted and the objectionable governors changed, he will

resign and go to Europe.

Evidences of the administrations good faith in the promised changes is found in the assured truth in the rumor that Gov. Ladi of this province will soon resign and be succeeded by Gen. Fernandez. The latter is a pronounced adherent of Gen. Reyes, which shows to what extremes the government is ready to go to satisfy public opinion.

Vice-President Corral is to sail for Europe on April 12. Paris will soon be a center of Mexican dignitaries.

The situation is still very promising and the volcano we are sitting on keeps quite respectfully quiet though it grunts once in a while.

Chillico's New Head Crozen.

Arkansas City, Kan., Mar. 23.—Edgar A. Allen, supervisor of Indian schools in Oklahoma, was chosen to succeed John R. Wise as superintendent of the Chillico Indian school near here. Mr. Wise was chosen superintendent of the Haskell Indian school at Lawrence, Kan.

RUSSIA NOT YET SATISFIED

The Chinese Reply Will, It is Believed, Only Temporarily Satisfy the Czar's Demands.

Peking, China, Mar. 27.—The Chinese reply to the Russian ultimatum demanding acquiescence not later than today in the demands set forth in the Russian note of February 16 has been delivered, according to an announcement by the foreign board.

It is a lengthy document explaining and justifying the previous answers of China to the representations from St. Petersburg, and there is no doubt that it makes further concessions. The Russian legation believed that

the Chinese note would terminate the incident regarding Russian consular and commercial privileges in Mongolia temporarily; but the Chinese having discovered that Russia is reluctant to move its troops, will recommend soon, it is believed here, a policy of obstruction toward Russians in the interior. Accordingly, it is believed that the whole issue will be only aggravated by the latest exchanges.

RUSSIA WANTS DIRECT REPLY

is Upon the Point of Addressing to China an Ultimatum Fixing a Date.

St. Petersburg, Mar. 25.—Russia is on the point of addressing to China an ultimatum fixing a date for entire satisfaction of her demands.

The Chinese's replies to Russia's successive notes dealing with the demands of Russia in Mongolia have been described by the Chinese government as conciliatory, but the text in each case has been unsatisfactory to Russia, because it has evaded the points at issue.

The last Chinese note received by the Russian government consents to the establishment of a consulate at Kobdo, whereas Russia actually demanded its location at Sharasumo, to which place the Chinese transferred the administrative seat of the district. The Chinese reply also attempts to limit Russia's rights in trade to articles of foreign origin, whereas the treaty specifies that Russia's right extends to merchandise of any origin and coming from any country.
