## Balance in Toll Bridge Fund Goes to Highway Dept.

### Louisville Bridge, Now Toll Free, Reprinted Just Prior to Its Purchase by State.

Under the terms of a resolution passed by the County Commissioners at their first meeting in September, the cash balance left in the Louisville State Aid Toll Bridge fund at the time the bridge was taken over by the state and made toll free, has been paid to the Department of Roads and Irrigation of the State of Nebraska, to be applied on the \$62,049.57 paid by the state to the bridge company. The bridge was reprinted just prior to the transfer and turned over to the highway department of the state in first class condition.

The Commissioners approved renewal Mothers' Pension orders by the County Judge for Maggie Herrington, Elsie K. Tweton and Belle Coakley.

An agreement was also entered into permitting Christian C. Stohlman to divert surplus water from terraces in his farm to the public road adjacent thereto.

The claim bill of Gustave Whitley in the amount of \$25.00 for foreman of a NYA project two weeks during July, was disapproved.

Bids were opened at their meeting of September 19, for bridge construction and on mass concrete and concrete culverts, pursuant to published call for bids. Four firms submitted bids, Monarch Engineering Co., of Falls City, Nebraska; Midland Construction Co., Omaha; H. A. Risk Pipe & Construction Co., Nebraska City, and Inland Construction Co., Omaha.

The bids were checked and it was determined that the Monarch Engineering Co. of Falls City had the low bid on bridges and H. A. Risk on mass concrete and concrete culverts.

Two days later on September 21, the Board again took up the matter of bids and after due consideration, it was moved by Commissioner H. C. Backemeyer, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Norris and carried, that all bids be rejected, the certified checks be returned to the bidders, and "the Board of County Commissioners buy material and hire labor to repair and build such bridges as in their judgment is for the best interests of the county."
